## ***The future of ISO 27001 and BS 7799 and the potential impact globally***

***Guest speaker: Paul Felstead, ISACA & KPMG***

The goal of BS7799 / ISO 17799 is to provide a common base for developing organizational security standards and effective security management practice and to provide confidence in inter-organizational dealings.

BS7799 was developed at the beginning of the 1990s in response to industry, government and business requests for the creation of a common information security structure. In 1995, the BS7799 standard was officially adopted as a re-publication of the earlier DTI security code of practice. Since then, improvements and extensions have been made to the standard, with a focus on information security management systems. In December 2000 and subsequently ISO adopted the standard naming sections ISO17799 and ISO 27001. The British institute has not stood still, and there have been further recent developments which will have national and international impact.

In his presentation, Paul will provide an overview of these changes to BS7799 and ISO17799 followed by a view of how it will impact the user community including management, information security management practitioners, technical specialists, consultants, auditors and other stakeholders.

At KPMG, Paul has responsibility for the Assurance and Certification service line to provide services associated with national and international standards and other adopted criteria such as BS 7799/ISO 17799, BS 15000/ITIL, tScheme, WebTrust/Systrust, SAS 70/FIT 1/94 and Capability Maturity Models. Over 15 years, Paul has gained a wealth of experience in the assessment and implementation of various management system schemes in the fields of Quality, Process Management and Information Security. Some of this was with BSI where he was responsible for all the IT Service and Information Security Management clients certified to ISO 9000.
