Information Leakage and Identity Theft

Guest speaker: **Del Heppenstall**
Deloitte Enterprise Risk Services

Del is a Senior Manager heading up the Security & Privacy practice in the Midlands within the Deloitte Enterprise Risk Services consulting practice. He has worked in the IT industry for 15 years, of which 12 have been spent in security, specialising in Vulnerability Management.

During that time he has led the Attack and Penetration services at both his previous employers, attempting to breach not only the logical security of applications, systems and networks, but also targeting the physical security of the infrastructure and buildings, including the use of social engineering. He has also performed design and implementation work, intrusion testing, incident handling, risk assessment, risk mitigation, computer forensics and network design on numerous assignments in various industries. This includes financial services, ISP's, and central and local government as a CHECK team leader.

In addition to client facing work, Del has conducted research and development of current and new vulnerabilities and developed and implemented security standards for multiple platforms and diverse system environments.

In his presentation, Del will demonstrate the challenges business today face in protecting their information that is core to their business. He will look in detail at some of the recent high profile security breaches involving customer data, and the serious impact and pressure that these breaches are putting on companies to take immediate measures to protect consumer information.

He will examine the challenges of having to comply with the growing complexity of regulations and legislation such as the Data Protection Act (DPA) and the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCI DSS) and how these challenges can be addressed by your business.
